4.1 Description of first aid measures

General advice

Nitrogen oxides (NO_x) Silver/silver oxides Container explosion may occur under fire conditions. Not combustible. Has a fire-promoting effect due to release of oxygen. Ambient fire may liberate hazardous vapours.

Stay in danger area only with self-contained breathing apparatus. Prevent skin contact by keeping a safe distance or by wearing suitable protective clothing.
